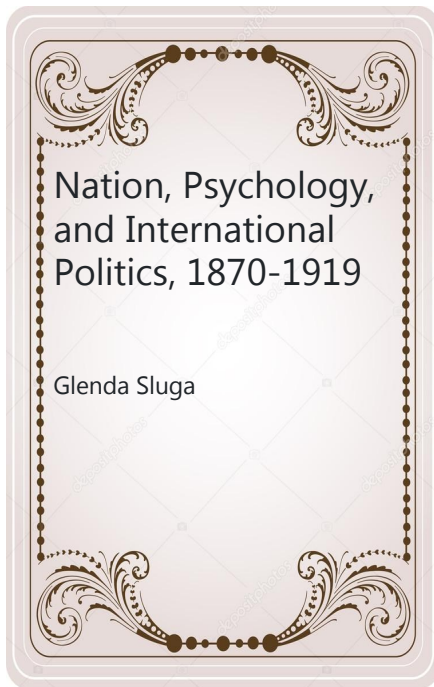


Nation, Psychology, and International Politics, 1870-1919
